It certainly was a wonderful experience and a great time for The King's School Family to be together and enjoy wholesome entertainment provided mostly by our very own learners in the High School. We so appreciate all who served, donated prizes and went the extra mile.

Our Wow moment for the term has to be when the entire school got together and formed the S.A. flag in the auditorium, and sang Shosholozza for the Vodacom competition. What a unifying experience and such a proudly S.A. moment!
